

FRONTIER GAMES CHAPERONE POLICY

The following list is meant to give coaches and supervisors an idea of what their role entails:

1. At the Frontier Games, you will be responsible for the students from your school, but also should watch for the behaviour of all students.
2. Your job is to:
 - Supervise students
 - Make sure all students are participating in the events they are registered in
 - Encourage students to get to their events on time
 - Encourage and model fair play and sportsmanship
3. Your help might be required with the running of the events themselves, such as refereeing and scorekeeping.

To avoid problems, coaches should not referee games that their teams are participating in.
4. Coaches/supervisors are expected to be at the Frontier Games events the entire time.
5. Whether students are in the gym, a classroom, or at off-site entertainment, **STUDENTS MUST BE SUPERVISED AT ALL TIMES.** Parents are entrusting coaches/supervisors with their children's safety and this is a responsibility that cannot be taken lightly.

It is strongly recommended that at least one (1) teacher chaperone attend the Frontier Games with other chaperones being either teachers, parents, or educational assistants. The ratio for supervision should be one (1) responsible adult for every seven (7) students with both a male and female chaperone.
